

Digger Derrick

- Operators must be certified according to OSHA if the equipment is used for construction work.
- Certification is mandatory in some industries.
- Developed by subject matter experts in electric utility and telecommunications.
- Tests cover two top hazards: Safe operation around power lines and communication with ground personnel.
- Certified Mobile Crane Operators can add Digger Derrick Certification with just 1 Written Exam.

Articulating Boom Crane

- Operators must be certified according to OSHA if the equipment is used for construction work.
- Large contractors and government entities are demanding certification.
- Developed by experts familiar with applications in material delivery, roofing, and sign installation.
- Tests account for the functionality of a knuckleboom crane.
- Certified Mobile Crane Operators can add Articulating Boom Crane Certification with just 1 Written Exam.

Service/Mechanics Truck

- Operators must be certified if the crane has a capacity greater than 1 ton and is being used for anything other than equipment maintenance and repair.
- Service/Mechanics Trucks with cranes are used in all industries, especially heavy construction.
- Developed by subject matter experts familiar with mobile cranes and the OSHA 1926.1400 regulation.
- Tests cover proper truck set-up when used as a crane and how to determine crane capacity.
